SOCRATIC CIRCLES

Guidelines for Participants -Inner Circle

- · LISTEN carefully.
- Speak up so that all can hear you.
- DONT raise your hands; take turns speaking.
- Value others opinions, but refer to the text if you need to defend your thoughts! This is not a test of memory!
- · Discuss ideas rather than each other's opinions.
- . Ask other people to clarify, or explain, what they mean.
- · It's OK to 'pass' when asked to contribute.
- Stick to the point and it's OK to make notes about ideas you want to come back to.
- Talk to each other, not just to the leader or teacher.
- YOU are responsible for the dialogue!

Be prepared to discuss and support your observations. (Examples to observe for are listed below.)






