<p>1. Discuss <u>novel basics</u>, using notes or Powerpoint:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intro • Genre • Setting • Characters • Plot • Plot resolution • Theme • Recommendation <p>Possible points = 60</p>	<p>2. Create a <u>poster</u> promoting the novel as a new release.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include information about the author. • poster board size • Use persuasive language to encourage people to buy your book. <p>Possible points = 51</p>	<p>3. <u>Act out</u> a scene from your book.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Costume/props realistic for character • Short paragraph explaining the scene (written or oral) <p>Possible points = 45</p>
<p>4. Write a <u>one-page, double-spaced, character sketch</u>. This is NOT a picture. It is TYPED description/analysis of a single character.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical description • Personality • Actions • Motivation • How this character is like/unlike you. <p>Possible points = 80</p>	<p>5. Write a <u>book review</u> of your book as though you are the book critic for the <i>Courier Journal</i>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A brief summary of the story • Critical analysis – “This is good . . . this is bad . . .” • Recommendation <p>Possible points = 68</p>	<p>6. <u>Write a test</u>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 10 multiple-choice • 10 true/false • 5 essay <p>Indicate the correct answers for the multiple-choice and true-false.</p> <p>List suggested responses to the essays.</p> <p>Possible points = 60</p>
<p>7. Develop a <u>travel brochure</u>, using Publisher.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the setting as a vacation destination. • Provide pictures and a physical description. • Points of interest • Recreational opportunities • History, if applicable <p>Possible points = 60</p>	<p>8. Develop a <u>setting map</u> of the setting, using Publisher.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A map of the setting that includes important areas where the action takes place. • Pictures of the setting • Write a paragraph explaining ways the setting affected the story. <p>Possible points = 51</p>	<p>9. <u>Redesign</u> the book cover.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Front cover: title, author’s name, picture pertaining to the book • Back cover: synopsis of the book, author information, and one “praise” comment from another source <p>Possible points = 45</p>
