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Educate: Students & Families

Communicate

- Begin early talking to students/families about competitive employment/post secondary education
- Utilize parent advisory councils, communities, organizations to share career planning initiatives

Share Research

- Setting high expectations
- Employment First
- Family engagement in career planning and transition

Develop Learning Opportunities

- Provide training to families on their role in the career development/work-based learning activities
- Provide opportunities to meet with service agencies
- Plan family informational meetings

Collaborate & empower families to engage in career development.

Collaborate & Empower

- "Back to School" Night
- Ask students/families to share student strengths, interests, hobbies within home and community
- Provide opportunities for work in the home and community
- Develop and reinforce employability and technical skills
- Build opportunities within home and community to increase employability, technical, and independent living skills
- Plan parent college and career readiness workshops
- Provide opportunities to learn and practice decision-making and goal setting skills
- Utilize families as career guest speakers
- Promote transition events designed for students and families
